DEFENDING MIGRANCY

PROF. ALICIA SCHMIDT CAMACHO

Sarai Ribicoff Professor of American Studies & Ethnicity, Race, & Migration, Yale University

This talk discusses migrant social movements within a transnational framework, highlighting the ways migrants seek to defend their mobility and at the same time articulate the right not to migrate. By examining political economy and hemispheric policies for border policing and immigration enforcement, the lecture attends both to the particular vulnerability of migrants to dehumanizing violence, and the way migrants' demands for protected, rights-bearing status fall outside state-centered proposals for legalization.
